Assessing extent & quality of implementation

The IAT is designed as a matrix of 60 indicators covering:

- . **Overarching fundamental functions**
- . **Elements related to receiving and responding to requests**
- . **Proactive disclosure**
- . **Records Management**

The IAT assesses these government functions through the following components:

- . **Leadership**
- . **Rules**
- . **Procedures**
- . **Resources**
- . **Monitoring**




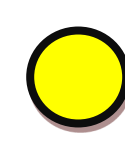
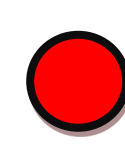
Methodology

The IAT methodology includes the following:

- . **Use of local researchers**
- . **Blind peer review of preliminary findings**
- . **Focal group review of findings**
- . **Carter Center quality control at every step of the process**
- . **Comprehensive report inclusive of quantitative and qualitative data**
- . **Multi-stakeholder meeting to share findings and identify priority actions**

Measurements

Indicators are graded using a “stoplight” method:

-  **The administration has done well / met good practice**
-  **There have been some efforts taken by the administration, but improvements are needed**
-  **There have been insufficient or non-existent efforts in implementation**
